Aims of the Club

- To encourage and further the study of conservation of Australian birds and their habitat.
- ▲ To educate members and the public, encouraging an interest in Australian birds and their habitat.

Formed in 1976, the Hunter Bird Observers Club (HBOC) is the largest club in the Hunter Region that caters specifically for those with an interest in bird life in its natural habitat.

Bird watching requires minimal equipment, gets you outdoors, encourages you to see more of the country and provides opportunities for research and socialization.

The Hunter Region contains many bird watching sites of world significance, including two registered Ramsar sites (*Hunter Estuary Wetlands*, near Newcastle, and *Myall Lakes* further to the north) and six Key Biodiversity Areas (KBAs).

Club activities include

- Monthly field outings, usually held on Tuesday and Sunday mornings, that cater for every range of expertise.
- Camps, often on Public Holiday long weekends and midweek.
- Regular field surveys to record information about the local distribution of birds, which include shorebirds, waders, woodland birds & birds on some offshore islands.
- Monthly Club nights featuring guest speakers and general discussion:
 - Second Wednesday of each month (except January), 6.30pm at the Hunter Wetlands Centre, Sandgate Road, Shortland.
- Visitors are most welcome.
- Working with other bird and environment groups, such as BirdLife, LLS, NPWS.
- Submissions on environmental issues.
- Working with local companies to achieve favourable environment outcomes.
